Everyone should now have their Home Learning Pack. This will hopefully give you lots of ideas about how you can support your child's learning at home. This can be supplemented with items you have at home and if your child needs to self isolate or school has to close we will supply your child with an additional home learning board and supplementary resources, if needed.

Nursery Theme for January and February

Our topic for this half term will be 'Cool Times' as children will be learning all about the weather in their own environment; observing and caring for the birds in winter



and learning about life in the polar regions. We have a great many stories to read, activities to explore and lots of penguin/polar bear crafts to do.

We will be discussing the winter weather and the clothes we need to keep us warm and dry and will be trying to continue our learning experience outdoors so please ensure your child has a warm coat and a hat, scarf and mittens. We will also be enjoying a range of Chinese New Year activities and the children are sure to enjoy eating with chopsticks in our Chinese restaurant.

Language and Communication

We will continue to develop our attention and listening skills. We are working on our retelling and sequencing skills, such as recalling gifts we received at Christmas or events we enjoyed.

We will be encouraging the children to make marks on paper and lots of our imaginative play will involve 'writing' such as pretending to write down a customer order in our cafe. If children are interested, we will be showing them the correct way to hold a pencil—this may still be very difficult for most children so don't worry if your child cannot do this yet!

Early Mathematics

We will be developing our rote and touch counting skills as we count lots of items around nursery. We are thinking about 'pairs' and will be sorting and matching socks, mittens, shoes and wellingtons! We are focusing on the colours white, silver and shades of blue and will be sorting and continuing patterns using these colours. Children will be observing and talking about 2D shapes including triangles, circles and squares. We will also be introducing the new 3D shape, a cube, as we plan to do lots of building with cubes!

Physical Development

Our focus continues to be the development of the children's fundamental movement skills. This month we will be developing our hopping skills. We will try rabbit hopping, kangaroo hopping and will even have a go at hopscotch!

We will also use our polar animals to help us focus on how they move and travel. We will be transporting penguin eggs on our feet and thinking about how we might huddle together or glide and slip!
