Self Help Skills

We are currently working on our self help skills and we would appreciate continued parental support at home. Remember, our children love praise for their achievements and are so proud when they say 'I did it!' - the more you do for your pre-school child, the more your child will learn a sense of helplessness and learn to rely on adult support. We will share a little video via Seesaw which shows some of our pupils **putting on their coat independently**. We are also focusing on **changing shoes** and putting these into our box, and **pouring our own water and milk** at snack time.

Parking

When parking outside, please be considerate of local residents. We would ask that you do not obstruct driveways and observe the flexible pick-up and drop-off times. Please do not enter the staff car park even when gates are open unless accessing the disabled parking spaces.

Pick Up and Drop Offs
