# Self Help Skills

We are currently working on our self help skills and we would appreciate parental support at home. Remember the more you do for your pre-school child, the more your child will learn a sense of helplessness and learn to rely on adult support. We are currently working on our self help skills and we would appreciate parental support at home. We will share a little video via Seesaw which shows some of our pupils putting on their coat independently. We are also focusing on changing shoes and putting these into our box, and pouring our own water and milk at lunch and snack time.



#### **Parking**

#### **Bear Show and Tell**

After the success of last week's colour show and tell, we are planning to have the children share another photo and some information about their favourite teddy book. This will coincide with our



work around Goldilocks and the Three Bears. If you could send a photo next week we would really appreciate it. The children will be asked to *point out something special about their bear, such as an item of clothing*. The learning potential for this time is both to encourage your child to communicate information effectively to their friends, boosting their confidence and also to listen carefully while someone else is talking (turn-taking). Please make sure your child understands what is in the photo and will be able to speak (very briefly) about it!

#### Friday Deep Clean
